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

BRENTWOOD PROGRAMS

The Brentwood Residential Addiction Treatment Program is abstinence based. Our Family Systems model of treatment consists of meetings, one-on-one counselling and intensive group therapy. The duration of the Residential Program is between twenty-one and ninety days and is determined by the intake assessment and by the client's individual progress and needs. Brentwood recognizes the fact that recovery is a life-long process and aftercare is a key ingredient. For this reason, Brentwood also offers Alumni meetings, Follow-up groups, one-on-one counselling, Group therapy, Couples counselling, Couples groups, spouse and family support groups, Youth activities nights (Age 7 to 16 years). Social activities for the Program Alumni and their families include dances, the Children's' Christmas Party, Pig Roast and the Annual Picnic to name a few.

RESIDENTIAL PROGRAM

Brentwood's residential program is structured specifically to help the person with substance abuse problems achieve and maintain sobriety. Separate long-term and short-term resi-

AFTERCARE

When a person completes the program, he/she graduates and becomes part of the Brentwood Alumni. Extensive Aftercare services are provided to the recovering alcoholic and his/her family. These services include counselling, support groups, couples counselling and family support groups. For out of town Alumni Brentwood also has off-site satellite groups in Chatham, Toronto, Kingsville, Stoney Point and London. Out of district Alumni are also encouraged to use other self-help groups as part of their continuing aftercare.

WOMEN'S SUPPORT MEETINGS

Women are invited to attend the support groups held in the Kay Ryan Centre to further help them understand the Brentwood program and their own recovery process. These meetings are held every Wednesday evening and Thursday morning. Men's support is offered on an individual need basis.

JUNIOR YOUTH GROUP

Every Tuesday evening from 6:15 pm to 7:30 pm, September to June, Brentwood offers a support group for children ages seven to sixteen years old. At least one parent is required to

attend the group and participate with their child/children.

HEALTH SERVICES

A fully staffed medical clinic is available to deal with most medical problems. A physician is available one day a week and nursing staff are available in the clinic Monday through Friday.

REFERRALS

Referrals are accepted from hospitals, physicians, psychiatrists, the legal community, unions, withdrawal management, community agencies and employers. As well, self-referrals attend at the suggestion of family, friends, word of mouth or the information on our web site. A simple call to our Intake Office will begin the process.

FUNDING AND COSTS

Brentwood is partially funded by the Ministry of Health and Long-Term Care through the Erie-St. Clair Local Health Integrated Network (LHIN). As a result 30 residential (21 day program beds) are offered at no cost to residents of
