OUR PAST

Prior to 1961, a number of families in Essex County came together to demand and create services and supports for their children. They started with a one room school house with one teacher, four students and a borrowed station wagon.

In September, 1961 the Agency was incorporated and is now one of over 100 local Community Living agencies in Ontario serving people who have an intellectual disability and is part of a network of thousands involved in community living across Canada.

OUR PRESENT

Community Living Essex County has a strong membership governed by a volunteer Board of Directors, elected annually, and consisting of family members, advocates and other community members.

As a fully accredited agency through Focus Accreditation, supports and services are provided to over 600 people of all ages who have an intellectual disability and their families throughout Essex County. Supports include a full range of supported community living options, community involvement supports, employment supports, short break or respite supports, Special Services at Home (for children) and Passport (for adults).. A central role of the Agency is advocacy for people who have an intellectual disability and their families. We work in partnership with Ensemble (family leadership) and New Day (advocacy group).
